BBC filming in Goring - 12th July

Royal Horticultural Society (RHS) judges will be touring Goring on the afternoon of Wednesday 12th July to evaluate and

score the projects being undertaken this year by the volunteers of the Goring Gap in Bloom team.

As a result of the success of previous Gold Awards, Goring has been selected as one of 15 communities in the UK to be featured in a series of 15 episodes of a new BBC 2 documentary on the Britain in Bloom national competition.

Two of the main projects the BBC will be filming are the developing BT telephone exchange wild flower garden and the preparations for new garden being created on the 25m x 7m bank by platform 4 on Goring & Streatley station. The BBC selected Goring for various reasons, but particularly the team's willingness to take on ambitious and challenging projects requiring complex negotiations with national utilities.

During the tour around Goring, the judges give points for how clean and tidy the shops, houses, roads and gardens look, so perhaps residents can kindly help by tidying up their front gardens and the pavements outside their houses, removing posters and generally making the village looked cared for. Whilst there is a tour itinerary, the judges always drive around before the escorted tour starts to check out the whole village, so anywhere in Goring could be inspected.

Railway Electrification – train disruption in September

The next stage of work for the electrification of the Paddington Bristol railway, which passes through Goring and Streatley, will be to test the overhead wires in the Reading area. The train operator, Great Western Railway, says this will have an impact on all Thames Valley and High Speed Services on Saturday 16th and Sunday 17th September.



Services will operate hourly from Bristol Temple Meads and London Paddington with amended calling patterns and some extended journey times. At the time of writing, Goring and Streatley station is about to benefit from a lick of paint, using the new GWR green livery. Work was also due to start to extend all three platforms at the Reading end to accommodate the new, longer electric commuter trains due to begin service in January 2018. Vodafone is intending to replace the mobile phone network mast at the station. A schedule for this work has yet to be announced.

Road closures in Goring & South Stoke

The road closures will basically affect the South Stoke Road to the bottom of Flint Hill, Flint Hill to Crays Pond (ie the B4526 Reading Road from Goring to Crays Pond). This will only be in operation for 11:30 am - 12:30 for the Men's race and 15:30 to

16:30 for the Woman's race. The race will be doing two laps at this point in their races and will only take 10 minutes to pass each time so traffic will be moving in between.
