Appeal for witnesses

There is still an ongoing appeal for witnesses following a sexual assault on a woman in Goring.

Thames Valley Police say the incident took place at approximately 12.35am on Saturday, 5th August, on a path between Elvendon Road and Lockstile Way, opposite the Bourdillon Field.

The victim, a 25-year-old woman, was cycling along the path and was approached by a group of five males who were all aged between about 16 and 20 years. One of the group approached the victim and assaulted her by touching her inappropriately. The offender is about 5ft 11ins tall, of a slim build and with brown hair in a centre parting. He was wearing dark clothing and had a bicycle with him. (The victim was not injured as a result of the incident).

Investigating officer Sergeant Mark Allmond, based at Abingdon police station, said: "I would like to hear from anyone who has any information relating to this incident, or who has any information which they think could help our investigation".

Caught On Camera

The incident of a lorry badly damaging the house and demolishing the external chimney stack at The Bull crossroads on 23rd November last year was watched live, as it happened, by the West Berkshire traffic management team in Newbury. The video footage was then used as evidence in an insurance claim. The 360 degree camera situated above the traffic lights has been in place for almost 2 years. (It does not, by the way, record vehicle speeds.) As reported last month, the 6 weeks of work to repair the building will

require the closure of Streatley Hill (B4009) until 6th September.

Hitachi Capital Invoice Finance Leaving Goring-on-Thames

Hitachi Capital, a business with offices in Goring, are closing down their local operation and apparently consolidating the Goring operations into their existing offices in Telford.

LED Lights Replace Sodium Lights At Goring & Streatley Station

On 2nd August, new LED lights were fitted on all platforms (15 singles & 9 doubles) to replace the old sodium lights. The new ones are more efficient and include motion sensors that reduce output by up to 20% when no movement is registered. Trains or people will reactivate them to their full power output. Interestingly, Goring-on-Thames Parish Council is

also currently looking into options and funding to replace the 200+ streetlights in Goring with LED options.

The first session is free to all. All classes are free for carers accompanying the person they care for.
