



An Extraordinary Parish Council Meeting (EPCM) will take place in Goring Village Hall at 7.30pm this Wednesday 13 September 2017. All are welcome.

The issues to be discussed relate to the offer of a new primary school for Goring and the Neighbourhood Plan (NP).

There will be an extended Public Forum so that

attendees can share their views, as well as a **Q & A session**, so that individuals can seek clarification about the relevant issues.

Following presentations and the general discussion, the council will consider two motions put forward by councillors:

- **1.** That the council agree to support the school to work through the process to get the best school facilities for Goring.
- 2. To consider, should the first motion be passed, whether that support would depend on the work being done outside the NP process, or to request that it be within the NP process.
