Planning Permission is sought for Fish & Chip Shop in Goring High Street

An application for full planning permission has been submitted to South Oxfordshire District Council for Change of Use for the old Lloyds/TSB bank premises in Goring High Street from A2 user class (Financial and Professional Services) to part* A5 user class (Hot Food Takeaway).

*Full planning permission is sought for the Change of Use of part of the ground floor to split the use between an A5 Hot Food Takeaway to be used as a Fish and Chip shop, and to retain the remainder as A2 or potentially to A1 should this become necessary in the future. The residential use at first floor is to remain without any alterations.

The application will be discussed by the Parish Council at the next planning meeting in the council offices at 7.30pm on <u>Tuesday 27 March</u>. Residents have the opportunity to make comments directly to the planning committee in the public forum before the councillors discuss the application.

TSB closed its branch in the village in June 2017. The building was previously a Lloyds branch up until 2013 when it merged with TSB and changed to a TSB branch.

Following TSB's sale of the bank building, including the flat above, the purchaser tried, unsuccessfully, to sell the property on by auction. The owner has now acquired a tenant who has applied for planning permission to change the building's designated use to set up a fish and chip shop business. The proposal is for three full-time staff with opening hours of 12 midday - 10.30pm, Monday-Saturday and 4 - 10pm Sunday.

The application for the change of use of the premises as a fish & chip shop was registered on 6 March with SODC by Mr Muhammed Abul Hasan of Reading. The application was sent to Goring-on-Thames Parish Council and the neighbouring properties on 15/16 March for consultation. The consultation period started on 15 March and ends on 11 April with a 'Target Decision Date' of 1 May.

The diagram on the right shows proposed changes to the ground floor layout. See planning application for full details.


