Reminder: Goring Neighbourhood Plan Public Hearing

Wednesday 11 July, 10am, Goring Village Hall

The Examiner appointed to review the Goring Neighbourhood Plan has called a Public Hearing to be held at 10.00am Wednesday 11 July 2018 at the Goring Village Hall. The hearing is, of course, open to the public, but is strictly limited to consider:

- Whether the number of dwellings (94) in policy 01 [NDP page 35] is appropriate;
- 2. Whether the allocation of the sites specified in policy 01 is appropriate;
- 3. How many dwellings are likely to be delivered on the sites specified in policy 01 on or before 31st March 2033; and
- 4. Whether any other site considered in the NDP process should be allocated for housing.

The Examiner has accepted the request of some specific individuals to present evidence, and all comments will be limited to the specific questions being addressed. No others will be allowed to speak.
