# **Judgement day on Wednesday**

- for Goring's bid to win Gold again!

On Wednesday (July 18) the RHS judges from Britain in Bloom will arrive in Goring to see and hear how the Goring Gap in Bloom group has been working with the community to enhance the village's environment.

They will be looking at their achievements, past and present, but it's important also they see a litter-free village, clear of weeds and overgrown hedges along the pavements, clean gutters along the roads, tidy noticeboards and no fly posting on telegraph poles etc. All of these cause deduction of valuable points.

Please get out there before the day and take a good look at how tidy your property, garden, pavement, gutter and local area generally looks from the street. Ten minutes, to remove any litter, pull out weeds, do a bit of hedge clipping and sweeping up, could make all the difference.

The judges will be taken around by the Bloom group along a pre-arranged route to show them some of the key projects they have undertaken this year, however, prior to meeting the group in the car park, they always drive around other roads which are not on the 'official tour route' to see for themselves how the rest of the village looks, so tidying up every property and part of the village is important.

#### **Be Water Aware this summer**

Drowning is one of the leading causes of accidental death in the UK and here is an important message from the Fire & Rescue service:



With the long hot sunny days, there is a temptation to cool off in one of Oxfordshire's and Berkshire's many rivers and inland waterways. While there may not be any river monsters waiting down there, unfortunately rivers and waterways can be very dangerous places - 255 people accidentally drowned in 2017 in the UK.

That's why, at this time of year, Oxfordshire's Fire and Rescue Service is reminding all residents to **Be Water Aware** to help everyone stay safe this summer.

#### Would you know what to do?

Knowing what to do when someone gets into trouble in the water could help save someone's life:

• Call: 999

• Float: tell them to float on their back

• Throw: something that floats

- Events can be put up at short notice better late than never as can cancellation notices if disaster strikes.

#### **Goring Gap Players**


Auditions for William Shakespeare's Comedy Twelfth Night





#### Oxfordshire South and Vale Citizens Advice
