Goring's Bloom team wins Gold again

Best ever result in the Thames & Chilterns Region of Britain in Bloom competition, winning three awards at the annual Awards Ceremony.

In addition to the main 'Gold Award' in the Small Town category, the team also won the 'First in Category' trophy and the Regional 'Pride of Place' award. Entries included cities, large and small towns and villages throughout Buckinghamshire, Berkshire and Oxfordshire. Goring Primary School's contribution was awarded a 'Highly Commended' in the Mark Mattock Schools Challenge.

For the third consecutive year, Goring has won Gold in the competition. This is in recognition of the hard work of many dedicated volunteers who work all year round to enhance our community for its residents, businesses and visitors.

"Winning the main regional 'Pride of Place' award was," says chair Stephanie Bridle, "a great achievement. It is given to the one entrant, be it a small village or a city in the three counties, demonstrating the highest level of pride and endeavour in its community."

The judges said of Goring Gap in Bloom's efforts on winning this award: "'Pride of Place' features in all that one observes in this small town. It is not just to do with cleanliness and tidiness, but a total sense of pride from all the participants in what they do and achieve. The Bloom project has encouraged businesses, residents, individuals and families to get involved in caring for their village. Grotty beds at the back of the car park, around the public toilets and along paths have been cleared and planted with perennials and bright sunflowers. Wheelbarrow displays encouraged local businesses to participate in a theme-based activity and an increasing number of premises provide their own displays. Finally, but by no means least, commuters now benefit from an embankment filled with new plants at the local railway station."


REMINDER: Keep Goring Tidy: autumn clean-up
