Floatability

Coming soon – a new opportunity for people with disabilities to enjoy the river

Floatability CIC is a new not-for-profit Community Interest Company set up to provide access to the river for physically disabled people or those with mental health difficulties or special needs. This service hopes to be operating next summer.

The organisation feels that this will help to improve health and wellbeing for those who are often unable to access the river. They are currently fundraising for a specially designed accessible boat (a Coulam V20, pictured, designed in association with the Wheelyboat Trust) and hope to be up and running by June 2019 operating from the Goring Gap Boat Club facilities.

Floatability will provide nature tours in the Goring stretch of the river with the potential for some fishing and other activities also if desired.

The new accessible boat will seat 4 wheelchair users, with carers if required or 8 able-bodied passengers. Carers go free and there will be 2 members of Floatability staff onboard at all times. They will offer affordable group trips, with an opportunity for lunch at a riverside café with accessible toilet and parking facilities.

The main aim is to reduce the isolation that can be experienced through lack of proper outdoor activities. Two of four of Directors of Floatability are disabled with different health conditions and so understand well the issues associated with disabilities and they want to provide a safe and caring environment for people to meet, socialise and experience the joy of being on the river.

The business is embedded into the community so that any surplus revenue and the assets will always be fed back into the business for the community. Floatability is in the process of fundraising and will be relying solely on funds raised through grants and sponsors. There will be lots of food and music too as well as our guest star Santa, who will be hosting a grotto on the day upstairs in The Village Chocolate Café.

The wonderful, twinkling Christmas Tree, again kindly donated by Yattendon Estates Ltd and Lord Iliffe, will be a centre-piece in the Rectory Garden and Pierreponts will also be there selling mulled wine, mince pies and soft drinks to add to the atmosphere. Monies this year will be raised in the Rectory Gardens for ABF, The Soldiers' Charity.
