## Two public consultation opportunities on the proposed extension to the car park at the Swan Hotel, Streatley

**Saturday 8 December 10am - 12noon**

**Monday 10 December 5pm - 7pm**

The Swan Hotel has just announced that it will be hosting two 'drop-in' sessions at the hotel for people to come along and learn more about the proposed extension to its car park at the rear of the hotel.

Full details of the proposed extension, including maps and every other aspect of the planning application will be on display. The location will be the Bar area to the rear of the hotel and each session will have two senior staff members present throughout to answer any questions local residents may have.

On the Saturday morning session Lucy Potter, Managing Director of the hotel, will be present, along with Lorraine Rose, Project Manager. On Monday evening, it will be Michael Westenbrink, Operations Director for the Rarebird Group (The Swan and The Great House at Sonning) and Lorraine Rose.

The planning application link for this proposal on the West Berkshire Council website will be published, along with all the other local applications, in the 'Planning Applications Alert' section of the next Genie newsletter due to be sent out mid-December.
