SPREAD THE WORD: All are invited to a public meeting to question the three candidates for District Councillor representing Goring and South Stoke - this Monday 29 April, 7.30pm at Goring Primary School.

This is your opportunity to ask each candidate why they should have your vote on Thursday 2 May - or just come to listen to the discussion.

Questions will be grouped into topic areas focusing on local District Council issues, and one or two from each topic will be selected for presenting to the candidates. The aim is to cover a range of issues, presented in a similar format to the well-known TV and radio programmes.

If you would like to propose a question to the panel, there will be forms available in the hall (please arrive prior to 7.15pm to submit questions), or you can e-mail them in advance to news@genienews.org. The moderator will ask those individuals who posed the selected questions to ask them of the panel. The moderator will then ask each candidate in turn to respond.

It is expected that the event will be concluded between 9-9.30pm.
