
### **Road Closures**

1. Closure of Aldworth Road (B4009) in the Westridge Green and Aldworth area, on 19 September between 9.30am & 3.30pm

This 6 hour closure is to enable contractors to carry out drain clearing in the vicinity.

The closure will be in place from the junction with Reading Road, to the junction with Lewendon Hill. The diversion is via Reading Road, Pangbourne Rd /

Pangbourne Hill, Shooters Hill (A329) and vice versa. (Access will be maintained for residents within this stretch of road.)



# 2. Suspended. The road closure of Streatley Hill (B4009) at The Bull traffic lights has been suspended following repeated problems with the work.

At the moment the proposal by West Berkshire Council's traffic department is that the road closure will be put back until the school autumn half term period, beginning Monday 28 October. A further announcement in Genie will be made when the details are agreed.

The closure has been for work to reconstruct the chimney of the Bull pub following a traffic incident when an overturned tractor damaged the building.


### **Norman Radley**

Norman's family has asked us to include the following announcement:

Norman Radley, long-standing Goring resident and pillar of the community, passed away peacefully on Friday 13th September at the Old Vicarage, Moulsford. He was 99.

Norman had lived in Goring since 1957, was a long-standing member of the Parish Council and was deeply involved with a wide range of other village organisations. He was awarded the Freedom of Goring in 2002. His many contributions to village life were also recently marked by the unveiling of a plaque on Goring Station.








# Update on what's happening to the empty shops in Goring:



1. The hairdressing salon in Station Road (previously trading as Taylors of Goring), which closed on 12 August, as reported on 16 August, is planning to reopen next month on 4 October.

At this point no further information on the new name for the salon or the management can be revealed, but it is hoped that this will be reported in a subsequent *Genie* newsletter





2. Original Pilates, the new Pilates and Yoga Studio at 4 The Arcade, will be open for private (1 person) and group classes (of 2-5 people) between 7am & 7pm, seven days a week.

3. The name of the new business which may be moving into the vacant shop next to the fish & shop (previously Swift Office Stuff) cannot be revealed at this point, but an announcement may be able to be made in the next issue.



4. The new fish and chip shop in the High Street is slowly moving towards an opening date (not fixed as yet), but the internal decoration is almost complete and the sign over the shop will be put up within a week or so. It will be called, as reported previously, *Riverside Fish & Chips*.

## The 'Twinning Tap' – a gift from Bellême

Some readers may have noticed the mounted, decorative tap, pictured, which has recently been installed at The Swan Hotel, Streatley.

The tap was a gift from the Bellêmois to celebrate twinning and is mounted on a stone block bearing the town's crest. The tap was designed to be installed at a location where it could be seen and used by everyone in Goring and Streatley.

A number of locations were investigated, including Goring Village Hall and by the lock, but none proved viable because of issues with water supply, drainage and the amount of special plumbing required. With the full support of the hotel, the tap was installed on the wall of the Boat House near the main entrance and was working for the opening of the Coppa Club on 22 July 2019.

The water is potable and a plaque with an inscription in French and English will be in place by the tap very soon.

# Petty vandalism at Goring & Streatley Station

This is an example of the petty vandalism which has occurred a number of times, including this weekend, where the floral displays have been destroyed or damaged. The incidents appear to occur late at night and are noticed the following morning. People who witness these events or have information about them should contact the British Transport Police by phone on 0800 40 50 40 or text them on 61016.

These station displays are provided by volunteers of Goring-on-Thames in Bloom for the benefit of commuters and other station users. They also have formed part of the Bloom group's entry in this summer's RHS Britain in Bloom competitions. Results of the recent judges' visits to Goring will be announced on 24 September (Regional competition) and 25 October (National finals) and *Genie* will report the outcome.
