

A campaign, 'Stop the Sale of Streatley

In the 28 September issue of Genie, we reported that the YHA had put the property on the market. At the time of writing, nine parties have viewed Hill House, mostly property developers. It is being marketed online and by a local estate agent for £950,000 Freehold as a 9-bed detached house with vacant possession.

More Road Closures in Streatley and Aldworth

An 18 day road closure on Streatley Hill and a one day closure in Aldworth planned for November.

1. Gigaclear is extending its broadband fibre network and Streatley Hill will be closed between 11 and 28 November daily from 9.30am to 3pm from the junction of Wallingford Road to the junction of The Coombe. Gigaclear say, however, these times may change.



The remaining sections of the network to be completed, which include some private land where access has been agreed, are still being confirmed. Once a complete programme of works is drawn up, there will be further information from Gigaclear.

The Unnamed Road from the B4009 to Ambury Road in Aldworth will be closed for drainage investigation works. All through traffic will be diverted via the B4009, Bell Lane and vice versa.

Goring-on-Thames in Bloom wins Gold Medal and also 'Best Small Town in the UK' award in RHS Britain in Bloom National Competition

At the national awards ceremony and dinner in London's Lindley Hall, Westminster on Friday evening (25 October) about 450 contestants from 68 communities throughout the UK awaited the results of their horticultural, community-building and environmental endeavours.

The Goring-on-Thames in Bloom committee represented the 150 or so villagers who, in some way, contributed to the local gardening and other community activities

throughout the year. They were delighted to be awarded a Gold medal and also the prestigious national award of Best Small Town in the UK. For further details

The judging criteria applicable for all categories from Small Village to City is based on census data and Goring is just a hundred or so people above the Large Village number, so it is placed in the Small Town category (3,000-6,000 people).

Sixty percent of the marks are allocated to non-horticultural activities with 30% for Environmental Responsibility, 30% for Community Participation and the remaining 40% for Horticultural Achievement. In all 3 sectors, Goring achieved Gold.

In their written report, the judges remarked on a number of areas where Goring excelled. The hanging baskets were said to be the best they had seen anywhere in the UK and especially won praise as, unlike all other communities' baskets seen in the competition, Goring's were all homemade and watered by volunteers and not readymade by commercial suppliers.

The 'Sunflower Shower' made from recycled single-use plastics was said to be an imaginative way of involving the community and sent out a positive environmental message. The quality of perennial planting was also recognised and especially evident at the large railway station garden, along with other creative projects to enhance the station, such as the wildflower mural.

Goring Parish Council Planning Committee recommend approval of the planning application for 20 new houses on the land to the east of Manor Road, Goring

At the planning meeting on Tuesday evening (29 October) the council discussed one of the applications for new dwellings on a site proposed in the Goring Neighbourhood Plan which was approved by Goring residents in the recent Referendum.



It is an outline planning application, so there are a number of Reserved Matters that will need to be confirmed in order to be compliant with the Goring Neighbourhood Plan. The application on SODC's website can be viewed here: P19/S2923/O.



This twice monthly 'Planning Alert' lists all the current planning applications submitted to SODC (South Oxfordshire District Council) and WBC (West Berkshire Council) relating to properties in Goring, Streatley and South Stoke, and occasionally other applications that are locally relevant. They are listed by parish, in expiry date order, so the applications with the shortest periods in which to respond are at the top.

New applications, if there are any, will be added to the lists in subsequent Alerts and existing ones will remain until the consultation period has expired.
