**In this issue:** Election Hustings in Goring; MIGGS prize draw; more road closures; GWR timetable changes; what's on in the second half of November; latest YHA Streatley news – and our latest update of new planning applications.

**Two road closures in November** Streatley Hill again (18 November to 2 December) and emergency closure of Blandy's Lane, Upper Basildon (to 20 November)

Streatley Hill is to be closed again every day at various times for 15 days between Monday 18 November and Monday 2 December



The closure will be between the A329 Streatley

crossroads and The Coombe. <u>On weekdays</u> the closures will be between 9.30am - 2.45pm. <u>At the weekend</u> there will be a full closure from 9.30am Saturday 23 November through to 5pm on Sunday 24 November.

Diversion will be via Reading Road, Pangbourne Hill and the A329. The closure is so Gigaclear can install fibre optic cables and make connections to premises.

Access to premises will be allowed but the direction of approach will depend on the state of the works. The intention is the works will start from the Coombe junction and progress towards the A329 crosroads.

#### Emergency Closure – Blandy's Lane, Upper Basildon

Blandy's Lane, Upper Basildon is closed from 14 to 20 November 2019 between its junction with Mead Lane and its junction with Park Wall Lane.

The alternative route for all vehicles affected is via Darby lane, Aldworth Road, Bethesda Street, and vice versa.

This is an emergency closure so Thames Water can repair an 'active' leak within the carriageway. Residential access will be maintained throughout and the diversion will be signed on site.

### A Prize Draw to help keep Goring Readibus on the road MIGGS (Mobility Issues Group, Goring & Streatley) is aiming to raise £800 before Christmas to keep the Goring Readibus on the road from April next year

Readibus is the fortnightly, door-to-door shopping bus for elderly and disabled people in the Goring area. It is funded jointly by Goring parish council and voluntary donations raised by MIGGS. MIGGS has agreed to continue its support if the cost can be raised in time.

Tickets will be on sale at the meeting of Goring Gap Local History Society on **18 November** (2.30pm, Goring village hall) and from MIGGS, phone 01491 873481 or contact <u>miggs@gmail.com</u>. The draw will be made in December and the result announced in Goring Gap News in January.

The prizes, donated by Great Western Railway, are one pair of first class, anytime tickets for use on GWR trains. The second prize is a pair of standard class tickets with the same validity. Together, the tickets have a potential value of over £1,300, depending on the journeys taken. Destinations include Penzance, Hereford and Swansea.

The draw is limited to 175 tickets, with a maximum of 5 tickets per person and one prize per household. So, the chances of winning a prize with one ticket are about 1 in 84 and with 5 tickets about 1 in 17.

### Streatley Youth Hostel sale Latest developments

The YHA Board has asked Genie to publish a statement to affirm its desire to retain the hostel as part of the YHA network by seeking a franchisee to lease or purchase the property. The statement explains the rationale for putting Hill House on the market. You can read the full text of the statement by clicking Read More below.

The 'Stop the Sale of Streatley YHA Group' has also asked us to publish an update of its campaign. It describes the high level of support it has received so far and the over 1,000 page views on its Facebook page and its plans to escalate the campaign and how supporters can help.

### YHA Statement – Streatley

The YHA Board of Trustees constantly reviews how best to evolve our network to ensure that we prioritise our resources to deliver on our charitable mission. In recent years, it has become clear that the costs of YHA directly maintaining all of our hostel network to an adequate standard is simply not affordable for us as a charity.

We have looked at alternative operating arrangements for those hostels in our network where the costs of refurbishment are not financially sustainable for us in the long term.

In some cases, this has led us to consider, reluctantly, the closure of hostels. However, this is not our preference. We have developed a new 'Enterprise' or franchise model whereby we either lease or sell a hostel to an entrepreneur who continues to operate the hostel under the YHA brand, but has the means and incentive to provide the investment that the hostel needs. Around 35 of our 150 hostels are successfully run using this model at the moment.

YHA Streatley is a hostel that we have been looking at in this light. The YHA's Board desire is to retain the hostel, but it is in need of significant investment which, for YHA, is financially unsustainable in the long term. We have therefore been looking at Enterprise as an alternative way forward. We have committed to continuing this search vigorously until at least July 2020, to maximise the chances of finding a suitable partner, and to that end we are keen to work with the local community to explore whether there might be any potential local partners whom we might pro-actively approach.

We are very proud of our network of over 150 hostels which exists to support our mission as a leading youth charity. Our focus in YHA is to support all, especially disadvantaged young people, to improve their mental and physical health and wellbeing and to develop crucial life skills. We remain immensely grateful to all those benefactors who have helped YHA through gifts – in Streatley's case that has helped us operate the hostel over the last 84 years. We are in touch with the family who originally donated the property to YHA.



Further to the article in the last Genie about starting a campaign to Stop the Sale of Streatley YHA there has been a great response. Thank you to everybody who has been to our Facebook Page and 'liked' us – over 1,000 page views!

Thanks also to those who have written to the YHA Chief Executive to express their concern. We have seen a generic response from the YHA stating some platitudes such as

- 'The hostel needs money for significant investment and maintenance in the hostel' this we know is untrue as it is in good condition and there have been no costed plans for any development.
- They also say that it is 'not financially sustainable' again untrue as it makes £50k a year profit for the charity!

We are developing plans for the campaign to stop this reckless action - and the next step we are looking at is to hold a public meeting (probably after the election and Christmas!). We are also going farther afield and linking up with interested groups such as The Scout Association, Centurion Running and the Ramblers.

# Major timetable changes to Great Western Railway services starting on Sunday 15 December

About one in three evening rush-hour fast trains from Paddington will NOT stop at Reading

Not only will train times be changing, the calling patterns for many services may also be different. For instance, about one in three evening rush-hour fast trains from Paddington will NOT stop at Reading.



GWR suggests everyone should check their journeys and to spread the message about the changes, details are on <u>GWR.com/timetable2019</u>.

As well as the big changes from 15 December, there will also be a temporary timetable in place while Network Rail work on infrastructure upgrades over Christmas and New Year.

This will affect services from Tuesday 24 December to Wednesday 1 January 2020 and includes the closure of Paddington station on Tuesday 24 December and Friday 27 December.
