This issue informs that after the removal of Travellers from the Gardiner Recreation Ground, the decontamination has been completed and the ground is reopened to the public.



Gardiner Recreation Ground now reopened The sanitisation has been completed

The Goring on Thames Parish Council is pleased to confirm that the Gardiner Recreation Ground has been professionally decontaminated and is now reopened. The company providing the service has certified the site as clean, and are providing the official documentation on Monday. We have been assured that it is suitable to reopen the site immediately, though, and the paperwork will follow.

Please note, because of the Covid-19 risks, the Pavilion and the play area remain closed until the Government guidance allows for them to be reopened.

The full damage from the unauthorised encampment of Travellers, removed on Tuesday 2 June, will now be assessed and necessary repairs and security issues will continue to be addressed in due course.

As previously requested, any reports of unlawful activity should be reported to the police in the usual way. Please also email the Clerk (clerk@goringparishcouncil.gov.uk) as she is keeping a record of the reported issues.
