Book your annual flu immunisation at Goring & Woodcote Medical Practice. COVID safe clinics to be held on **Saturdays 3** and **17 October** at Goring Surgery (01491 872372) and **Saturdays 10 and 24 October** at Woodcote Surgery (01491 680686). Phone to book your

appointment as soon as you can to secure your flu immunisation. This will be safely administered by one of our doctors or nurses, taking into account any allergy or other important information in your medical record. All clinics are being held between 9.00 a.m. and 3.00 p.m. in the surgery car-park, under the cover of waterproof gazebos, to keep you and our team safe and well during the current pandemic. **Flu immunisations on 3 October and 10 October are for patients aged 65+ only**. Please note, these will be "walk-through" clinics so unfortunately no parking at the surgery on these dates.

You may have received a letter from Lloyds pharmacy offering you a free flu jab. You can opt for this instead but **it is your choice**. Please phone Lloyds in Goring for an appointment as you cannot receive your flu jab from them without an appointment. They will only being offering free jabs to over 65 year olds, pregnant women, adults living with some specific underlying health conditions or if you or your family are / were shielding as a result of COVID-19. Lloyds will not vaccinate children.

Here is a copy of the consultation email from OCC:

We are writing to seek your views on the proposals to introduce traffic calming measures on the B4009 High Street in Goring-on-Thames, which are being proposed in order to improve road safety within the town Centre. Specifically the proposals include the construction of; a) a full-width flat top hump (raised informal crossing point) to be located approximately 40m east of Manor Road, and b) a build-out feature (with accompanying bollards) at the existing give-way markings outside 'The Arcade', which will narrow the carriageway to 3.25 metres. This follows a public consultation by Goring Parish Council in June 2017. They received the proposed scheme drawings and passed them to OCC Highways for thier approval in January 2020. This was reported in Genie Village Matters No 55 on 30 January 2020.
