farewell gesture from the people of **Goring and Streatley** There is a plan, if local residents would like to take

minute of silence at 8pm on Sunday evening together and remember and mourn the Queen as a community. It would reflect, but in a very different and poignant way, how the Goring and Streatley residents and their families and friends came together to celebrate Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee on 5 June.

Most people will have seen the details of the plan in Genie's last red-topped Public Information bulletin mailed to you on Wednesday, which has been extensively reproduced elsewhere. It features plans for a 'torchlight minute



of silence', marked by the church bells ceasing at exactly 8pm, with people assembled in a continuous single line along the pavements from Streatley traffic lights, across the river to Red Cross Road, If you haven't seen the details yet, please click this link. The people of Goring and Streatley were recognised by the Queen following our Diamond Jubilee's celebrations, which included a similarly large street party, one of eight major events on 3 & 4 June 2012. The Queen had looked at our Souvenir Book and DVD which were hand delivered to the Palace and wrote a letter afterwards to

us all saying she was, "delighted that so many people from both villages were able to participate ... and was glad to see that everyone had such an enjoyable time." The Royal Proclamation – The act and



30 minutes apart.

It is customary that the Proclamation is read out in towns and villages across the land after the first announcement in London.

Goring's ceremony took place at 2pm in the Rectory Garden and the Proclamation was read by Chairman of Goring-on-Thames Parish Council Cllr Bryan Urbick, observed by several

local residents. The Streatley event was at 2.30pm in St Mary's churchyard. The proceedings were introduced by the Chairman of Streatley Parish Council, Cllr Colin Smith and the Proclamation read by Streatley resident, and Deputy

Following both readings, the newly adapted National Anthem was sung, followed by three cheers for the new King. As seen in Goring's ceremony, the Union flag is flying at full mast, as is protocol, but was immediately

GGEO (Goring Gap Environmental Organisation) will be there with a Bird Box workshop, where children and families can make up and take away free swift nest boxes to help reverse the worrying loss of swifts. There will be other ways of how to improve biodiversity and how to get 'Green Fingers', including how to turn your lawn into a mini-wild flower meadow and encourage pollinators to visit and do their vital work for nature. 
