Local elections on Thursday 4 May 2023 – See who your candidates are here

Today (Wed 5 April), the names of all the candidates who have put themselves forward for council elections have been published.

For Goring-on-Thames, South Stoke and other parishes in South Oxfordshire, click <u>HERE</u> and scroll down to 'Who can you vote for?'

For Streatley and other villages in West Berkshire, click HERE

Are you ready to vote?

If you registered to vote by 7 March 2023 – you should have received your poll card. (If you haven't received your poll card, please contact your local council to check you are still registered using one of the links above.)

If you registered to vote between 8 March and 17 April 2023 – you should receive your poll card during the week commencing 24 April.

For both SODC and WBC – To vote by post in this election you must apply by 5pm on Tuesday 18 April.

Don't forget - to vote at the polling station in this election you must bring photo ID!

A range of photo ID will be accepted, including passports, driving licences, disabled parking blue badges and cards with a PASS Mark. Expired ID is acceptable, as long as the photograph is still a true likeness of you.
