



Little Meadow path improvements

"Due to the extended wet weather earlier in spring, we postponed the path improvements to mid-June at Little Meadow, near Gatehampton bridge, to make sure the ground underfoot would be sufficiently dry. Local contractors will re-engineer the path to provide a hard wearing surface so you can run and walk more safely in future years. It will also be restored to its original route closer to the river. 


