Road Closure: Hook End Lane in Lower Basildon will be closed from the 27 to 29 February 2024

The closure will be between its junction with Unnamed Road from Hook End Lane to Westfield Shaws and its junction with Bennetts Wood.

Road Closures

Between 10:30 to 12:30 hours - vehicles will be prohibited from using Grove Road between Icknield Road and the B4009, and that part of Icknield Road between Elvendon Road and Woodcote Road, so as to ensure safety for participants and supporters.



Between 11.10 and 12.10 - on the B4009 at 2 road crossings in Grove Road, Goring and Ferry Lane, South Stoke, temporary Stop and Go Boards (implemented using AA Signs) will be used to assist runners and pedestrians.

A plan of the closures can be seen HERE.

Exemptions to prohibitions are included for emergency services, and subject to the safety and progress of the race, for vehicular access to premises which are only accessible from the closed sections of road.

The alternative route clockwise for traffic is west via Elvendon Road, north on the B4009 Wallingford Road, eastwards on Woodcote Road, and south on Icknield Road, and vice versa.

Graffiti problem in Goring will be tackled – with help from volunteers and permission from **Network Rail**

An article in the current February issue of Goring Gap News (p21) from Goring-on-Thames in Bloom drew attention to the age-old problem of dealing with unwanted graffiti, especially the common 'tag' type (a form of signature) seen on the railway bridge at the top end of Goring High Street.

Bloom is looking for volunteers willing to remove this latest outbreak and is awaiting written permission from Network Rail to repaint the two long vertical sections of the bridge below the parapets with regulation Network Rail green paint, which NR will supply. The area of each side of the road needed to be painted is 30sqm, so 60sqm in total. We understand from Network Rail that written permission will be forthcoming once the required risk assessment and method statement have been approved and evidence of Public Liability insurance is provided.

The Mounted Section of Thames Valley Police is looking for a new police horse

Do you have a brave horse suitable for a career in the police force, or know anyone who might have?

A message from the Mounted Section of the Thames Valley Police:

We are looking to recruit a new police horse to our team. Owners can be reassured that their horse will receive the best care and be with the police until retirement. In this exciting role, the horse will be an integral part of our police force and assist in a range of

duties including high visibility patrols, assistance in searches for missing people, as well as support to other local forces with their operations. Our mounted officers and police horses have extensive experience from managing large football crowds and protecting the Royal Family.

We are asking the public to get in contact about any horses which they believe would be a good fit with the following specification: Between 16.3hh and 18hh, mare or gelding, between the ages of 4-11. A heavier breed, such as a shire cross or Irish draught, and trainable with a good temperament and no behavioural traits or medical issues. All horses chosen will be required to undergo a six-week trial where we assess their suitability to the role and vetting. Owners can also have the knowledge that their horse will be serving the community and they can watch their horse on deployments, such as escorting the King up the racecourse at Royal Ascot.

Financial support for residents and

businesses affected by recent flooding

A quick update on the provision of financial support for residents and businesses affected by the recent flooding, caused by Storm Henk in January 2024.

Community Connectors at South & Vale write:

We are currently finalising our internal processes for access to this support. As soon as we commence payments, we will let you all know. We will contact anyone who has already reported flooding to us or Oxfordshire County Council (through the flood toolkit) to let



them know how to access available funds. We will also continue to update details on our websites and share through our regular communications channels.

 If you know people impacted by Storm Henk, please encourage them to report property/business flooding if they haven't already done so to: www.oxfordshirefloodtoolkit.com/emergency/report-flood.

 Please can you also ask them to drop us a line to <u>communityconnectors@southandvale.gov.uk</u> so that we can contact them as soon as funds can be dispersed correctly.

This may seem like doubling up, but unfortunately the Oxfordshire wide flood toolkit does not record contact details so if residents drop us an email address it means we can get in touch quickly and as soon as we are able to.
