Update on Streatley High Street Closure

Several gas leaks have been found and fixed. The pipes are now being monitored to ensure there are no more leaks before the holes are filled in. If all is clear the tarmackers will be called in but but because of the Easter Bank Holiday weekend there may be a delay in getting them on site. As a result, it is likely that the road will not be reopened much before next Friday.

Road Closures – the following are planned:

1. Streatley Hill between the Bull traffic lights and the

Coombe 3 Apr 09:30 to 12 Apr 15:30

The footway will remain open.

2. Rectory Road Streatley 9 April 2024, 09.30 to 15.30

The closure will be between its junction with A417 Wantage Road and the entrance to Goring and Streatley Golf Club. Access will be maintained throughout for residents and the Golf Club. Please note blue light access will be permitted.

The purpose of this closure is to enable Scottish and Southern Power Distribution to carry out tree pruning around their network.

3. Road Closure at Mill Road, Goring

9 April 2024 up to and including 10 April 2024 between 08:00 and 17:00.

Limited access will be maintained for emergency service vehicles and for frontages within the closed section of road, subject to the progress of the works.

Suggested alternative route: via B4009, Cleeve Road, Mill Road and vice versa.

Further GWR Rail Strikes

The Aslef union has announced strike action that will affect GWR and Chiltern Railways services on Saturday 6 April

On Friday 5 April There may be alterations to GWR services during the evening.

On Saturday 6 April, a reduced, revised timetable will operate across several train operators, including GWR. Many parts of the GWR network will have no service at all and trains that are running will only be operating for a limited period during the day and will be extremely busy. There will be no replacement bus services. If you intend to travel where trains are running, please check before you travel at <u>www.gwr.com/check</u>. Other train operators are also affected by this action, so onward travel could also be affected. Anybody who has already bought a ticket for travel on Saturday 6 April will be able to claim a full refund. For full information please visit www.gwr.com/strike. Online journey planners are being updated.

On Sunday 7 April services could also be affected by a limited number of short-notice cancellations and alterations.

'Action short of a strike' may cause further disruption from Thursday 4 April to Saturday 6 April and Monday 8 April to Tuesday 9 April, with some short-notice alterations or cancellations. If you are travelling during this period, you should check both outward and return journeys before travelling.

Re: Field next to White Hill Burial Ground in Goring, within **Chilterns Natural Landscape**

This hearing will take place at the Fountain Conference Centre, Howbery Park, Benson Lane, Crowmarsh Gifford, OX10 8BA.

Members of the public are welcome to attend each day of the inquiry and can speak, if they so wish, at the discretion of the Inspector. The hearing will start at 10am on Tuesday 9 April and could last up to 3 days.

This enquiry relates to an application proposing the material change of use of land for mixed use of Equestrian and Residential, through the formation of a Gypsy/Traveller pitch providing 1 Static Caravan/Mobile Home and 1 Touring Caravan, alongside ancillary development on Land known as Field Adjacent to Burial Ground Driveway off Reading Road, Goring-on-Thames, Oxfordshire, RG8 0LL. 

Vote for your next Thames Valley Police & Crime Commissioner on Thursday 2 May

The Thames Valley Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) is an elected official tasked with setting out the way crime is tackled by Thames Valley Police in Oxfordshire, Berkshire and Buckinghamshire.





The post was created in November 2012, following an election and replaced the Thames Valley Police Authority.

Residents already registered to vote in SODC or WBC elections should have received a Poll card. If you are not registered to vote with your local council authority, the deadline to register is midnight Tuesday 16 April. (See https://www.gov.uk/register-to-<u>vote</u>.)

For other key dates, please see your relevant local authority website for these elections, including the need to take one of the acceptable forms of photo ID to the polling booth.

Residents urged to sign up for polling station work in South Oxfordshire

South Oxfordshire District Council is appealing for more people to come forward to work as poll clerks and presiding officers to help run polling stations on Thursday 2 May for the Police and Crime Commissioner Election.

There are still around 40 vacancies at polling stations across the district and the council needs to confirm arrangements as soon as possible. Officers are particularly keen to hear from people who are available to work in Henley and the surrounding area.

The following positions are available to those who are 18 or over and entitled to work in the UK: Presiding Officers: (previous experience preferred): £251.00 – Thursday 2 May, 6.15am to 10.30pm Poll Clerks: £200 – Thursday 2 May, 6.15am to 10.30pm

Mark Stone, Returning Officer for South Oxfordshire, said: "We need to fill these roles as quickly as possible, so if you are available on 2 May and interested in working at the elections, please get in touch with our Elections team."

The council would also welcome expressions of interest from people who would like to hear about job opportunities for the general election which is expected to take place later this year.
