Goring's Victorian Boathouse now listed by Historic England Saunders' Victorian boathouse, High Street, Goring-

By 1901, Saunders had relocated to the Isle of Wight, building his first flying boat with a 'Consuta' hull. His business expanded into powerboats, gunboats, airship gondoliers, lifeboats, and aircraft, producing recordbreaking vessels. In 1928, Sir Edwin Alliott Veron Roe, aircraft designer and manufacturer, invested in the company, which became Saunders Roe (Saro Ltd), known for such famous designs as Sir Malcolm Campbell's Bluebird speedboat (1937). An Oxfordshire Blue Plaque was added to Saunders' Boathouse in 2013 to celebrate
